PROGRESS REPORT 5-6 JUNE 2007 MEETING HERITAGE CENTER, BISMARCK, NORTH DAKOTA

Background

On 5-6 June 2007, staff from MHS met with representatives from cultural institutions to discuss the Great Rivers Cultural Heritage Network (GRCHN) project. The purpose of this meeting was to provide an overview of the GRCHN project, report on the work done on this project to date, and identify target audiences, corresponding content, possible partners and future projects. Discussion

On June 5, 2007 MHS staff met with participants for a full-day meeting. Bob Horton gave an overview of the GRCHN project and discussed ways in which MHS will develop a new infrastructure that will expand its capability to manage, preserve, and provide access to digital content. Working in collaboration with partners in Minnesota, North Dakota, and South Dakota, MHS will extend these services to other institutions and become a digital content and service center for the cultural heritage of the Upper Midwest. The presentation outlined a basic three-year work plan and defined the roles of project participants. Sustainability and collaboration were identified as key elements for the success of the project.

Irene van Bavel discussed various digital initiatives undertaken by MHS to develop digital resources and tools that enhance access to its collections. They include the digitization of

newspaper collections through the NDNP Program, the digitization of the *Minnesota History magazine*, the Geography and History Online project, the development of an open-source online exhibitions tool (Omeka), the Immigrant Oral Histories Project, and the Shared History Project with Canada, among others.

Marj Kelly reported on the development of PeopleFinder, a federated search tool that provides integrated access existing resources on the MHS website. She went on to explain the iterative processes and workflows involved in making our partners' digital content accessible through this application. There were discussions about branding and logo and participants stressed the importance of retaining their institutional identities or "skins" when viewing their material online. Many county historical societies and cultural institutions in Minnesota and North Dakota develop digital content in PastPerfect and ContentDM and the project will examine the ways to export and retrieve data from these two systems.

The afternoon session focused on specific content and audiences of the North Dakota partners. During our brainstorming, common elements emerged that helped define the priorities for project activities.
